Mission Statement**

Heating and Air Conditioning Alliance of Indiana and its members will volunteer their technicians, trucks, and resources to provide heating assistance as follows:

- 1) To homeowners in the city of ***Indianapolis*** who are on fixed incomes and who could not otherwise afford to have their heating systems cleaned and checked. This program will run on Saturday, October 3, 2015.
- 2) To homeowners in ***Marion County*** who are pre-screened through certain adult service agencies who are on fixed incomes and who do not have other financial resources. The work will consist of clean and checks on furnaces and if necessary repairing broken furnaces.
- 3) To Not-For-Profit agencies in ***Marion County*** who service elderly and less fortunate people within ***Marion County*** – work will include preventative maintenance and repairs on heating systems, scheduled in advance on Saturday, October 3, 2015.

The recipients of the services offered through this program are screened and monitored through the proper local agencies. The “Bring the Heat” program is intended to meet the needs of agencies and people who need help to ensure their heating systems are operating safely.

What is Bring the Heat, Indianapolis?

- Bring the Heat, Indianapolis provides free heating services to elderly/disabled, low-income homeowners in the Indianapolis area to insure proper furnace operation and save lives.
- Volunteers provide no cost furnace clean-and-check services to homeowners.
- Volunteers provide a ray of sun light, a smile, and a helping hand to people who need it the most.

How Can I Participate?

- Heating and Air Conditioning Alliance of Indiana needs service techs, installers, helpers, dispatchers, owners, managers, friends and family to help.
- Contractors are needed to volunteer the use of their trucks and parts (up to \$100 per home).
- Technicians are needed to run a couple of service calls (most are finished within four hours), diagnose the problem and if a minor problem, fix it. If it requires a major system component replacement, document it and give the information to the team leaders at the Heating and Air Conditioning Alliance of Indiana headquarters.
- Non-technical help is needed to ride with technicians, talk with the homeowners while the technician is making the needed repairs and helping in other ways as determined on the call.

How Do I Volunteer?

- **Heating and Air Conditioning Alliance of Indiana's Bring the Heat, Indianapolis! day is October 3, 2015.**
- Kick off occurs at: **Lee Supply, 3025 Madison Ave, Indianapolis, Indiana 46227.**
- Arrive at 7 A.M. for breakfast.
- Receive call assignments and then after final instructions by Bring the Heat coordinators, leave to complete the calls.
- Return to the headquarters office to return call packets and identify whether calls are completed or need additional follow up.
- Have lunch with other volunteers.
- **Go home knowing you have made a difference in someone's life!!**

Bring the Heat Program Facts

- The Heating and Air Conditioning Alliance of Indiana Bring the Heat program does not receive any government funding and relies solely on volunteers for donations of funds, labor, equipment, and parts.
- Bring the Heat, Indianapolis can dramatically improved the quality of life for elderly, low-income, and disabled homeowners in the Indianapolis area.
- Alliance volunteers have donated time, money, and parts to this program and in eight years have completed over 550 no cost furnace clean-and-checks and replaced over 38 furnaces.
- It is estimated that there are thousands of homeowners in Marion County who do not have a safe source of heat for their homes.
